This application was heard by the Honorable Kevin McKenney on May 19, 2004, in Department 16. The matter having been submitted, the court finds and orders as follows:

As indicated at the conclusion of the hearing, the application must be DENIED.

Plaintiff seeks a writ/order to prevent destruction of Bullis-Purissima Elementary
School essentially asserting that if the court declines to issue the writ/order that plaintiff will be
subjected to an unnecessary move which is proscribed by Education Code 47614. Plaintiff
claims that defendants' decision will locate plaintiff at the potentially undesirable/unusable
Camp Egan site with the prospect of a CEQA action. Plaintiff claims that the agreed upon site is
subject to the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the EIR under CEQA, which may render the
school unusable for plaintiff's purpose of operating a charter school. Plaintiff presents further

considerations in seeking the Bullis School, but the concern over an "unnecessary move" per Education Code 47614 is the primary focus of this application.

Defendants argue that an injunction cannot issue to compel discretionary acts such as those exercised by the school district and that plaintiff unconditionally accepted the Camp Egan site in a May 3, 2004, letter. (It is acknowledged that plaintiff sent a conditional acceptance on April 30, 2004, but sent the May 3 acceptance in response to defendants' April 30, 2004, letter.)

The court reviewed the extensive documents and can find no basis for jurisdiction to issue a writ/order. The evidence is that plaintiff is seeking injunctive relief for a discretionary act. Further, the court cannot enjoin what may be speculation about the Mitigated Negative Declaration. Contrary to plaintiff's assertion that it will be homeless, the district has offered plaintiff a site for the charter school.

The court's review of the record indicates that defendants complied with the requirements of Education Code 47614(b) by making "available...reasonably equivalent" facilities which "shall be contiguous, furnished, and equipped...." It further appears that defendants made "reasonable efforts to provide [plaintiff] with facilities near to where [they] wishe[d] to locate, and...not move the charter school unnecessarily." It is premature to enjoin any district action based upon speculation that the school may be moved unnecessarily.

After evaluating this application for injunctive relief, since defendants appear to be in compliance with the law, there does not appear to be an abuse of discretion in offering the Egan Camp site, and the CEQA concern appears to be speculative, the court must decline to order the relief requested.
