1. Welcome and Call to Order

a. Co-chair Ms. Katie Kinnaman called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

2. **Public Comment**:

- a. The following members of the public addressed the committee:

3. Approval of Minutes from Meeting 10:

a. Ms. Shali Sirkay made a motion to approve the Meeting 11 Minutes. Ms. Natalie Elefant seconded the motion. Minutes approved unanimously

4. Preparation of Interim Report to School Board:

- a. Ms. Kinnaman presented a draft of the interim report to the Committee.
 - i. The Committee discussed.
- b. The Committee reviewed the complete list of benefits and drawbacks for all 7 options. Committee members voted individually on the top 4 benefits and drawbacks for each option.
- c. The committee used an online survey to cast and tally the votes.
 - i. Option 1
 - Benefits:
 - a. 1002: Elementary schools have more space
 - b. 1007: Maintain neighborhood schools
 - c. 1017: More land, more amenities
 - d. 1019: Community supported
 - Drawbacks:



- a. 1102: Limits funding/flexibility towards existing campuses
- b. 1104: No Neighborhood school for NEC
- c. 1125: LONG: Find land, Purchase land, Construction
- d. 1103: If new land too small, No flexibility for BCS / 1105: Junior Highs larger than 600

ii. Option 2

Benefits:

- a. 2008: It addressed the conflict. BCS gets a campus / LASD fulfills obligation
- b. 2010: Maximum money for improvements to existing schools
- c. 2011: All schools benefit from bond money
- d. 2020: Average school site meets less than 600 students

Drawbacks:

- a. 2112: Community of the closed school will be upset
- b. 2113: Lose neighborhood school, more kids commuting longer
- c. 2118: Middle schools greater than 600 students
- d. 2102: Increased density could limit flexibility

iii. Option 3

Benefits:

- a. 3003: Financial Opportunity to apply funds not used for land to other needs
- b. 3018: Better than closing a school
- c. 3001: Opportunity to appropriately design currently shared space
- d. 3004: Maintains elementary 600 student limit/ 3012: Minimal impact to other LASD schools

• Drawbacks:

- a. 3109: Disparity between schools
- b. 3114: Relocated community may initially feel angry
- c. 3117: Higher traffic at both sites
- d. 3102: More demand on existing space
- iv. Option 4: Printing error: Committee will vote on Option 4 during Meeting 13.
- v. Option 5

Benefits:

- a. 5003: More flexibility at choice elementary campus
- b. 5019: Cost Savings
- c. 5015: Solves problem for next 10 years
- d. 5006: K-8 Magnet reduces population pressure on elementary schools

Drawbacks:



- a. 5101: Closing neighborhood elementary school
- b. 5106: One JHS conversion will be quite large / unweildy
- c. 5122: Traffic impact
- d. 5116: May start NEW conflict by closing school & competing school (magnet)

vi. Option 6

Benefits:

- a. 6006: Location of sites must serve same neighborhood
- b. 6007: Add land and facilities
- c. 6001: Keeps small schools intact
- d. 6011: BCS has its own site

Drawbacks:

- a. 6106: Resentment around relocation of neighborhood school
- b. 6103: More positive if NEC but not elsewhere
- c. 6101: Logistical challenges for parents, program, district
- d. 6120: Traffic implications

vii. Option 7

Benefits:

- a. 7011: Quick-relatively
- b. 7001: JHS stay similar size/Middle schools still have room for growth
- c. 7007: Good for BCS
- d. 7004: Class size remain within desired limit

Drawbacks:

- a. 7102: Causes disparity between elementary schools
- b. 7116: Creates more conflict with LASD
- c. 7121: Creates traffic
- d. 7108: Logistically challenging for families

- a. The committee will spend the next meeting finalizing the interim report to the board.
- b. Ms. Kinnaman encouraged the committee to attend the March 9th board meeting and make public comments
- c. Ms. Kinnaman adjourned the meeting at 8:52 p.m.
