## Blach Intermediate School Named a 2013 California Distinguished School

State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson has announced that Blach Intermediate School, in the Los Altos School District, is one of 218 public middle and high schools named California Distinguished Schools for their strong commitment and innovative approaches to improving student academic achievement. Only twenty-one middle and high schools in Santa Clara County were honored with this prestigious award this year. Elementary schools and middle schools are awarded in alternating years.

"Being recognized as a Distinguished School for the teaching and learning that happens at Blach each and every day is great validation for the work we all do," said Sandra McGonagle, principal of Blach Intermediate School. "It is incredibly rewarding to be a part of a school, district, and community where student learning and student success are a priority. At Blach, we are incredibly proud of the work we do and are thrilled to be recognized as a California Distinguished School."

The 2013 California Distinguished Schools Program directly focuses on the right of California's students to an equitable and rigorous education, and recognizes those schools that have made progress in narrowing the academic achievement gap. The application process consists of a written application, which includes a comprehensive description of two of the school's signature practices, and a county-led site validation review process, which validates the implementation of work being done.

The unique learning environment created by our faculty, parents, and students is a gem within the wider community," said Doug Smith, president of the Board of Trustees of the Los Altos School District. "Thriving neighborhood schools are at the core of what makes this such a wonderful place to live, and we are thrilled that outside experts have once again recognized an LASD school for the special contribution it makes to the quality of life in Los Altos, Los Altos Hills and Mountain View."

Given the enormous challenges schools have faced in recent years, it is inspiring to see this kind of success in so many schools.
